The principal place of business of the Three Pines Timber Co. Will be in Medford, the company having secured rooms in the Palm Lodge building which they will soon fit up for offices. The company has extensive timber holdings in both Jackson and Josephine counties and will probably develop a big timber industry during the present season." Rogue River Courier. April 30, 1903. Three Pines Timber Co.

1911 Town of Three Pines, Oregon Platted

"The Farwell Construction company is sinking the well that will supply this community with plenty of pure water for all domestic purposes, as well as for local irrigation. Fred C. Farwell, of the company, is clearing a five-acre tract and will plant to pears. Mr. Cook will go to Portland in a few days to purchase pipe for the water system." Rogue River Courier. June 2, 1911. Three Pines.

"The Farwell Construction company is rushing work on the deep well, which will supply water to the people here. Mr. J. D. Cook, of this company, is now in Portland purchasing the material for install the water system. Mrs. Cook accompanied him and will remain for a extended visit with her daughter, Mrs. Oliver Lutz, and other relatives and friends." Rogue River Courier. June 9, 1911. Three Pines.

"Mrs. J. D. Cook has returned from Portland, where she has been spending the summer with her daughter, Mrs. Oliver Lutz. Mr. and Mrs. Cook are now living in the office building of the fruit tracts company in apartments especially fitted for their company." Rogue River Courier. August 25, 1911. Three Pines.

J. D. Cook, Secretary, Three Pines Lumber Company

1912 Three Pines was recently developed and a going concern in 1912 with over a hundred citizens; a brand new one-year old school, Three Pines Elementary; two stores; the Corliss Hotel; a post office; a planning mill that was connected by a 11.5 mile flume to the upper reaches of Jump-off Joe Creek and the lumber town of Mountain; and a railroad siding and small depot.

1912 "Mrs. J. D. Cook and daughter, Mrs. Lutz of Portland, are visiting friends in Grants Pass and Medford." Rogue River Courier. January 12, 1912. <u>Three Pines</u>. "J. D. Cook is in Medford on business." Rogue River Courier. November 29, 1912. Three Pines

1913 "Mrs. O. E. Sulz [sic; Mrs. Oliver E Lutz], of Portland, has been visiting her parents, Mr. and Mrs. J. D. Cook at Three Pines." Rogue River Courier. January 31, 1913. Personal And Local

1920 U.S. Census York County, Maine

Jefferson D. Cook Head 54 years Henrietta Cook Wife 51 years Jefferson was a gold mine operator.

1928 Henrietta Cook died at Portland, Oregon October 14, 1928 (Certificate 2783).¹

1930 U.S. Census Multnomah County, OR Jefferson D. Cook Head 65 years

1953 Jefferson Cook died at Multnomah County, Oregon November 10, 1953.


