Corliss Creek is located in the Three Pines Fruit Tracts and flows south to Bannister Creek. It was named after the Ezekel and Levi Corliss families.¹

Levi Corliss Family

1911 “Everything is growing at Three Pines. There is thought of a development league in the near future. Skyscrapers are not yet in evidence, but the buildings that have in all cases proceeded them are in evidence more and more each day. Five carpenters are today putting the finishing touches on the Corliss hotel. It will soon be occupied and a much needed improvement will have been supplied.” *Rogue River Courier*. May 26, 1911. [Three Pines](#).

1911 “Machinery for the **brick yard** is being installed and the finished product will soon be on the market.” *Rogue River Courier*.” July 14, 1911. [Three Pines](#).

“William Rolph, superintendent of the noted Burrell orchards, will leave the employ of the company owning the same and move to the land he has

purchased here. He has rented the house now occupied by **L. T. Corliss** as a hotel and will live there until his own home on the fruit land is completed. **Mr. Corliss**, who owns the building, will move to



the house on the [?] where the brick yard of the **Three Pines Brick company** is located and give his entire time to the manufacture of brick. He is a practical brick maker, having spent some years in that business in Michigan.” *Rogue River Courier*. July 28, 1911. [Three Pines](#).

Levi Corliss Brick Factory & Shingle Mill

1911 “C. J. Perry and C. J. Dunton of the Tolo Brick company, were recently here inspecting the plant of the **Three Pines Brick company**. They report the clay to be fine for the manufacture of brick.” *Rogue River Courier*. August 25, 1911. [Three Pines](#).

“**L. T. Corliss**, who is manufacturing shingles on the **D. H. Clark place**, will shortly move the plant to a point near the railroad.” *Rogue River Courier*. November 17, 1911. [Three Pines](#).

“**L. T. Corliss** has rented space in the planing mill and is setting up his shingle mill and will get power from the engine of the lumber company.” *Rogue River Courier*. December 15, 1911. [Three Pines](#).

1916 Levi Corliss died December 21, 1916. He is buried at the Pleasant Valley Cemetery (lot B2/R5/L2).

1956 Mary L Corliss died Multnomah County 1956 [not necessarily the 1910 Census Merlin Precinct Mary Corliss since this would make her 99 years old, but not impossible].

The extended Marshall Halstead family has been living in Three Pines, Oregon since 1946. Edith “Edie” Halstead still lives on the old home place. John Halstead informed Mike Walker that his Dad was always digging up old bricks when he plowed his field.²

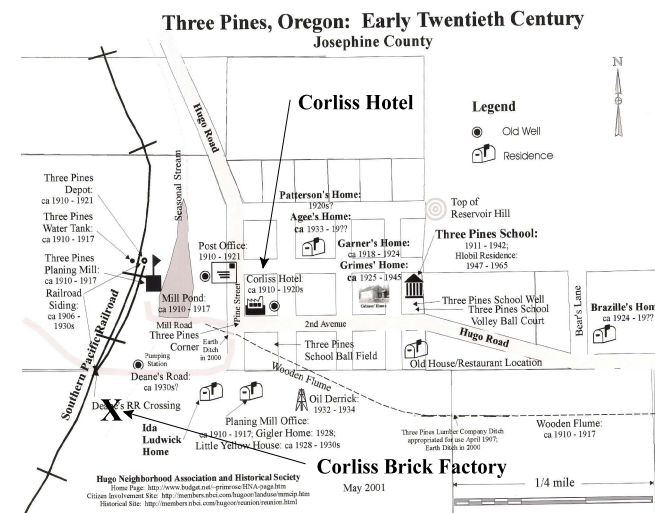
