H.A. and Celia Corliss had 4 grand-daughters.

1911 "Another sign of growth is the hotel being erected by E. S. Corliss. This building will have accommodations for about twenty regular patrons and able to handle a much larger transient business. The new hotel, the Corliss house, is rapidly nearing completion and when finished will be occupied by the owner and conducted in first-class style." *Rogue River Courier*. March 31, 1911. Three Pines.

H. A. Corliss Family: ca. 1894 - 1934

1911 Hazel Corliss, daughter of Herbert, married B. Franklin Pound of Marion County on October 20.1911. She was married to Cornelier in 1930.

1912 Three Pines was recently developed and a going concern in 1912 with over a hundred citizens; a brand new one-year old school, Three Pines Elementary; two stores; the Corliss Hotel; a post office; a planning mill that was connected by a 11.5 mile flume to the upper reaches of Jump-off Joe Creek and the lumber town of Mountain; and a railroad siding and small depot.

"H. A. Corliss made a business trip to Hornbrook Tuesday." Rogue River Courier. April 19, 1912. Personal And Local.

"H. A. Corliss left Wednesday for Scotts Bar, Cal., to resume work in the mines." Rogue River Courier. August 13, 1912. Personal And Local.

"An operation was performed this afternoon for the removal of the left eye of **H. A. Corliss**. The optic was injured several days ago by a piece of steel that was broken from a piece with which he was working in the mine near Yreka. He came here and every possible effort was made to save the eye, but as it was affecting the uninjured member, the operation was necessary, and it was performed at the Good Samaritan hospital." Rogue River Courier. August 16, 1912. Eye Removed.

1918 "Obituary - Mrs. H. A. Corliss was born October 27, 1855 [sic], at Fishport, Maine, and died at San Francisco, Thursday, October 24, 1918. She came to the Pacific coast in 1877 and has been a resident of Grants Pass and vicinity for the past 25 years."

1920s "In the 1910s there was a big two-story hotel located at Three Pines Corner. In later years it was abandoned and all the windows were knocked out. It was during the late 1920s that Clarence and the other kids used to play in it. They would go upstairs and out the back window to pick apples off an apple tree."
