The Culps, Hugo Settler Family: 18?? - 1908

1908 Culp Was Crossing Bridge Near Merlin — Could Not Get Away in Time To Avoid Engine.

Tuesday morning, as Train No. 15 neared the bridge over Jump-Off Joe Creek near Merlin, the fireman called to Engineer Wagenblast that there was a man on the track. The whistle was blown and the brakes applied, but the train could not be stopped in time to keep from striking him, though it was greatly slowed down. The man, Melvin Culp, saw the train and turned around and went the other way to get off the bridge but seemed to be excited and did not make much headway. The bridge is only a few feet high and he could have easily gotten over the side without much injury. Both legs were cut off and his body mangled, and the unfortunate man was dead when the train stopped to pick him up.

Melvin Culp was an old resident of Merlin and leaves a large family to mourn his untimely death. The accident was promptly reported and Coroner F. D. Stricker left at once for the scene and held an inquest. The jury decided that there was no one to blame for the accident. *Rogue River Courier*. December 18, 1908. Melvin Culp Killed By Train No. 15.
