The Hanson L. Darnielle Family, Early Settlers: ca., 1910s

1911 School commenced in the new building Monday morning, the 18th [September 1911] with 19 pupils in attendance. Miss Irene M. [Mabel] Darnielle of Grants Pass is the very efficient teacher. This community has an ornament in the new school house, which is up-to-date in all respects, for a country school. *Rogue River Courier*. September 29, 1911. Three Pines. Miss Irene Darnielle has been secured to teach six months more, which will make nine months for the school year. *Rogue River Courier*. December 8, 1911. Three Pines.

Mrs. Whalen has moved from Mountain and is living at this point to take advantage of the [Three Pines] school, now going successfully conducted by Miss Irene Darneille. *Rogue River Courier*. November 17, 1911. <u>Three Pines</u>.

In 1911 Irene Mabel Darneille was first teacher of the Three Pines Public School.

The Three Pines Lumber company having closed down for the winter is enclosing the planing mill where is stored a considerable quantity of choice fir finishing lumber. H. L. Darnielle, who has been in charge of the sales department, will leave here for his home in Grants Pass Friday and remain a few days with his family before going to Pleasant Valley, Baker county, to act in the same capacity for the Pleasant Valley Lumber company. Donald H. Clark will represent the company here. *Rogue River Courier*. December 15, 1911. <u>Three Pines</u>.

Hanson Foreman & Mabel Teacher

1912 Three Pines was recently developed and a going concern in 1912 with over a hundred citizens; a brand new one-year old school, Three Pines Elementary; two stores; the Corliss Hotel; a post office; a planning mill that was connected by a 11.5 mile flume to the upper reaches of Jump-off Joe Creek and the lumber town of Mountain; and a railroad siding and small depot.

1911 - H. L. Darnielle was foreman of the Three Pines Timber Company Planing Mill. 1913 - He was foreman of the yard at the Three Pines sawmill

Miss Mabel Darneille returned Sunday evening to Three Pines after spending Sunday with her mother. *Rogue River Courier*. March 29, 1912. <u>Personal And</u> <u>Local</u>. Miss Mabel Darneille visited over Sunday with her mother and returned Sunday evening to Three Pines. *Rogue River Courier*. April 26, 1912. <u>Personal And Local</u>.

1913 H. L. Darneille arrived Wednesday night from Klamath Falls and left Thursday morning for Three Pines, where he will be **foreman of the yard at the Three Pines sawmill.**" *Rogue River Courier*. .March 7, 1913. <u>Personal And Local</u>.

1917 By 1917 the Three Pines Timber Company was in financial trouble and the town was in decline.
