Harison H. Triplett was issued a
homestead patent for 160 acres in
Hugo, Oregon (Patent No. 2858). 1-2
Hugo would become famous for its fruit orchards,
some of them started by the Tripletts. 3-4

1895 H. H. Tripple [Triplett] was at his homestead (see map on title page).⁵

1900 Census The Triplett Family was living in the Merlin Precinct, Josephine County on June 1, 1900. Eveline Martin [Triplett] was the head of household.⁶

Hugo Culture The three Triplett brothers were the building contractors of their day in Hugo.⁷

1901 A social dance, under the management of H. W. Triplett and Chas. Bean will be given at the Hugo school house on the evening of March 29. *Rogue River Courier*. March 21, 1901. <u>Local Happenings</u>.

Charley Triplett was a passenger on Sunday's south bound train to Alameda to visit his mother. *Rogue River Courier*. May 2, 1901. Hugo Items.

The dance at Mr. Willam Purdy's Friday evening was a success in every respect, a large crowd in attendance for the music rendered by Mr. Geo. Scott and Henry Triplett was excellent. By Dick. *Rogue River Courier*. November 21, 1901. Hugo Items.

Clabe Triplett loaded a car of wood Saturday to ship south. He ships to Ashland and Grants Pass. *Rogue River Courier*. March 30, 1906. <u>Hugo</u>.

Mr. Peterson and C. W. Triplett have been shipping some very fine peaches and pears. *Rogue River Courier*. September 14, 1906. Hugo.

"The Meadows" - Apples, Pears, & Peaches

1908 C. W. Tripett, one of the leading orchardists near Hugo sustained a loss of at least \$2,000 on his fruit crop. He had gathered about half of his cherries and had intended to pick the balance for the cannery this week, but the hail literally stripped the trees of fruit, leaves and a portion of the limbs. He also lost between 800 and 900 boxes of apples and all his pears, peaches and other small fruit. Rogue River Courier. July 17, 1908. Disastrous Hail Storm.

1910 Jess Triplett met with quite an accident yesterday as his horse stepped in a hole and fell on him, dislocating his shoulder. The doctor was called and at this writing he is resting quite easy. *Rogue River Courier*. February 25, 1910. Sparks From Hugo.


