1874 William N. Triplett and Eveline “Evia” Murray married December 30, 1874 in Marion County, Oregon. They had five children.

1892 Harison Triplett’s Hugo Homestead On

March 23, 1892 Harison H. Triplett was issued a homestead patent for 160 acres in Hugo, Oregon (Patent No. 2858).

Harison Triplett = Henry H. Triplett? Henry H. would have been 33 years old in 1892.

Eveline Martin is Evia Triplett (see 1880 census). Perhaps Martin = Murray? Eveline was a farmer. James and Henry were railroad laborers.

1902 Eveline Triplett passed. “Mrs. Triplett was a widow, her husband, **Wm. Triplett**, having been drowned in the Rogue River some 17 years ago. She was 49 years of age. She leaves five children, three sons, and two daughters.”²

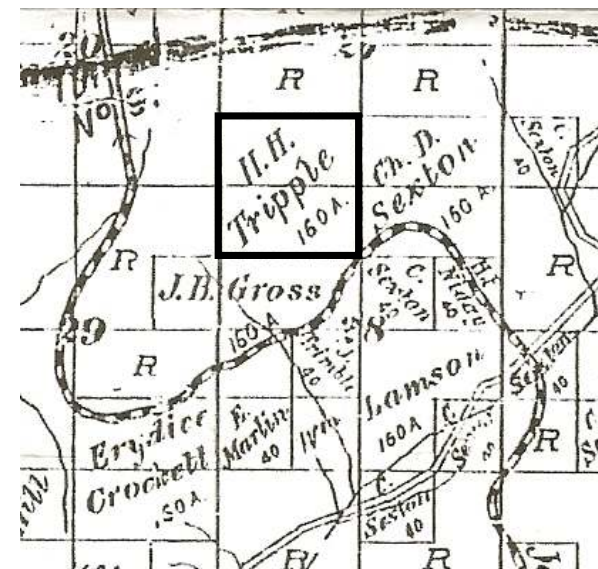
