Caspescha and Flish were partners and miners.

1882 Hugo Homestead On March 30, 1882 George N. Yocum was issued a homestead patent for 160 acres in Hugo, Oregon (Patent No. 1157).¹⁻²

1895 George had sold his homestead and by 1895 is was owned by the partners Caspecnoe and Flish.³

1910 Census, Grants Pass Precinct, Josephine County, Oregon

Both Caspescha and Flish are living in the Grants Pass Precinct on Burgess Street. They are still partners.

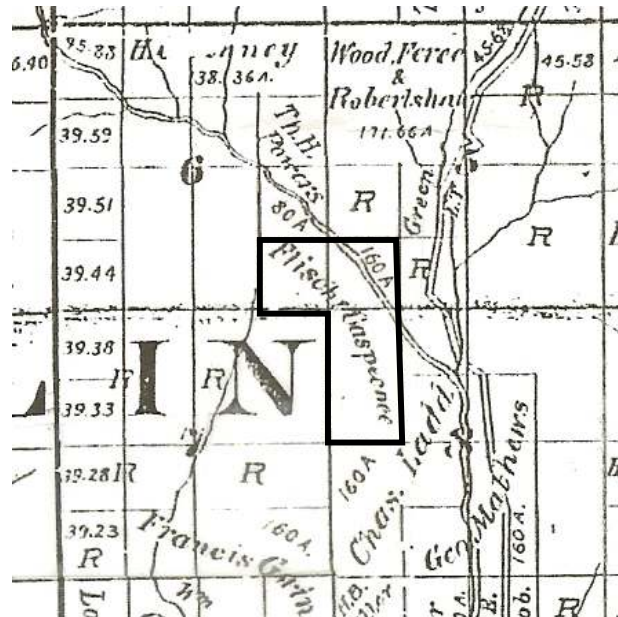

1932 The Caspescha ranch covered the good bottomland of Quartz Creek near its junction with Bummer Creek. The ranch later becomes the John C. Cochrane Quartz Creek Ranch.⁴

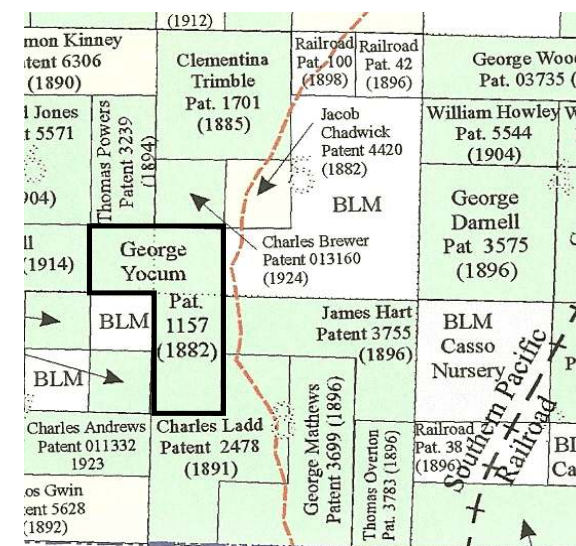
