

1882 Hugo Homestead On March 30, 1882 George N. Yocum was issued a homestead patent for 160 acres in Hugo, Oregon (Patent No. 1157).¹⁻²

The homestead ground covers the good bottomland of Quartz Creek near it junction with Bummer Creek. Much later it will become the John C. Cochrane Quartz Creek Ranch.

The George N. Yocum Family, Hugo Pioneers: 1870s - 19??

1895 At some point George sold his homestead and by 1895 is was owned by Flisch Caspecnoe.³
