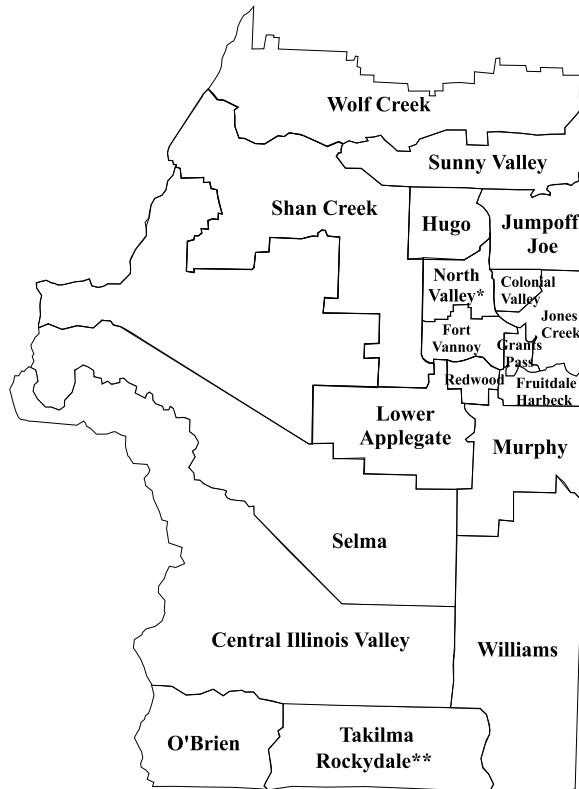
In January 2006 there were two active certified CACs:
