James & Elizabeth F. Neely Family

James Neely married widow Elizabeth F. (Vannoy) Gibson July 23, 1870. James Neely was a 43-year old farmer living in the Jump Off Joe Precinct in 1880. The following persons were members of his household: 35-year old wife, Elizabeth F.; 6-year old Florence; 4-year old Everet; 3-year old Edward; and 12-year old Elmer Gibson.

Elizabeth F. "E. F." Neely is identified on the official 1895 Josephine County map as the owner of almost 600 acres where the four Neely children's graves are located.¹

William Wallace & Elizabeth Josephine (Fontaine) Neely Family

W^M W. & E. J. Neely lost four of their nine children from 1877 - 1882. All four graves are listed with the Oregon Commission on Historic Cemeteries (OPS 97 & OPS 166).

James & William Neely Families James and William Wallace were brothers who with their 13member Edward and Ruth Neely family emigrated over the Oregon Trail to the Willamette Valley in 1854. Six of nine of the W^M W. & E. J. Neely children were born at the Neely ranch in Hugo, Oregon on Jump Off Joe Creek. The W^M W. & E. J. Neely family was in Hugo from at least 1875 - 1882. They were likely in partners with, or living with, the James and Elizabeth F. Neely family.²
