The study of ethnobotany focuses on the relationship between humans and plants. For example, many plants were used by Native American Indians as food, medicine, shelter, clothing, transportation, and ceremonial objects. Shooting star flowers were used as ornaments by women and at dances. The flowers were also hung on baby baskets to make them sleepy, and the leaves and roots roasted in ashes and eaten.
