JO CO JS&PSS The 2012 expiration of federal funding for public safety services resulted in two JO CO proposed levies as a solution. They both failed. The *Exploratory Committee* has a question: **"Is JO CO providing a minimally adequate level of PSS?**"¹⁻²



The NVCW Is About Citizens Protecting Their Community The NVCW first wanted to support and strengthen the local Neighborhood Watch programs of the area and establish on-going communications with them as well as with all citizens of the North Valley area. Secondly they ...wanted to form a

"Response Team" which would respond to the needs of the community that law enforcement could no longer provide.

NWCW RT Focuses On Crime Prevention It is a fact that the RT is a group of trained armed citizens that strongly supports law enforcement and that the use of fire arms by private citizens is a last resort. Due to extreme liability concerns, the NVCW & RT will not respond to incidents where law enforcement maintains a current policy of response. Training and deterrence are critical.


