JO CO Justice System & Public Safety Services

The 2012 expiration of federal funding for services resulted in two JO CO proposed levies as a solution. We believe an informed pubic will consider the question behind the 2013 Measure 17 - 49, the Criminal Justice and Public Safety Three Year Local Option Tax: "Is JO CO providing an adequate level of public safety services?" We believe adequately answering the question involves several sub-questions, the answers of which will assist the pubic toward informed decision-making.

Public Safety Services Research Projects of the *Exploratory Committee* are preliminary and focused on several areas.

Justice System & Public Safety Services Issue The 1937 O & C Act paid for services until 2000 when it was replaced by the "Secure Rural Schools and Community Self-Determination Act of 2000 (SRS; P.L. 106-393). The SRS was reauthorized in 2008 which has a four year ramp-down in funding and expired in 2012.

Historical Services? County Jail, Juvenile Justice Center, District Attorney's Office, Court Services, and



Animal Protection. Rural Patrols, Criminal Investigations and Related Sheriff's Office Support Services.

Historical Cost?Approximately \$12 million.

Historical Revenues Federal government.

Historical Remedies have JO CO focused on reducing county employees, reducing public safety services, and recently two proposed levies which failed

- 1. 05/15/12 Measure 17 43, failed 57 43 percent.
- 2. 05/21/13 Measure 17 49, failed 51 49 percent.

Laws Potentially Applicable to Issue U.S. Constitution, Oregon Constitution, JO CO Home Charter.

Proposed New Services JO CO 2013 Measure 17-49; 2012 ORS 203.009; OAR 213-070-0000 October 2010 breakdown of services by the Association of Oregon Counties' *Task Force on Effective and Cost-Efficient Service Provision*.

Standards For Services What are the standards for the services provided (i.e., what are the level of services)? The standards could be a range of alternatives from the minimal adequate standard to providing the services to some maximum)?

Factual Analysis What factual analysis was provided to citizens that the services meet or do not meet the standards?

Estimate of Revenues Needed For Services: Historical, Comparison, Actual, or Average What is the estimate of the revenues needed to return to or maintain the services for a range of standards?

Sources of Revenue What are the potential sources of the revenue?

Voter Approval Any proposal for taxes should be approved by the public.

State Intervention Should the state impose taxes?
