STAKEHOLDER ENQUIRY LETTERS TRANSMITTED TO JO CO MANAGERS: JANUARY 20, 2016

January 20, 2016 Enquiry Letters The purpose of the Committee's January 20, 2016 stakeholder enquiry letters was to explain the public safety *Study Design* idea and request a approximately one hour meeting to explain the idea. No requests were made, except for any reports on "necessary or mandated services" already created by the JO CO Managers in response to the August 19, 2014 request by Josephine County Commissioner Walker.

"Commissioner Walker urged the Managers to have ongoing conversations with their liaisons as they move forward and asked them to provide a **one page summary or outline showing what they felt were necessary or mandated services** (emphasis added), anything in their purview and how they thought it should be delivered would be helpful to the Board."

Example January 20, 2016 Letter/Email To Rob Brandes, Director, Josephine County Public Works Department Rob Brandes, Director of JO CO Public Works Department became the leader of the JO CO Management Team for the purposes of coordinating a meeting of the JO CO Management Team and the Exploratory Committee.

On January 20, 2016 thirteen members of the Josephine County Management Team were invited by individual letter/email to have a meeting with the Hugo JS&PSS Exploratory Committee. The contents of the 13 letters were the same (see Brandes and O'Hare example enquiry letters).

Arthur O'Hare, Finance Director, JO CO Finance Department, was the nominal coordinator for the JO CO Budget Committee.

Rob Brandes, Director, Josephine County Public Works Department; Sarah Wright, Parks Manager, Josephine County Parks; and Arthur O'Hare, Finance Director, Josephine County Finance Department responded to the January 20, 2016 enquiry letters. During the response period Rob Brandes ended up coordinating a combined meeting for all the JO CO Management Team members invited. He set the date and the agenda which was agreed to by the Committee. The date was set for March 7, 2016 and it occurred on that date.
