Especially applicable here are three survey notes (i.e., points) in Section 23 (Map 8). However, all points as to course and distance are important in the later comparison analysis to accurately plot road on 1998 USGS Quad (Map 9).

On July 11, 1997, Bob Chard, Engineering Technician III, Josephine County Public Works, developed a report on a road established by the Josephine County Commissioners on April 9, 1874 (Commissioner's Book 2, Page 261). Alex Watts, County Surveyor at that time, did a survey of the route. It is recorded as part of the Road Viewers Report as Road Number 12 (Book 1, Pages 40-45, May 20, 1874, copy enclosed).

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
