The 1856 General Land Office Field Survey Sub-Committee transcribed the field notes of five locations for the GLO's 1856 and 1894 maps¹ and calculated their latitude and longitude

This included developing the methodology for translating the notes, converting chains to feet, and plotting bearing and distances in feet on USGS topographic quadrangles. The last step was calculating the latitude and longitude from the plots on the quads. This effort is the prototype for calculating the latitude and longitude for all of Hugo's 30 points of interest.

There are 17 major "road" field note locations for the "Road from Willamette Valley to Jacksonville" within Hugo's routes of interest. They are numbered JA-1 through JA-17. Latitude and longitude were calculated for five locations on the Jacksonville Road: **JA-11** through **JA-15**.

The purpose of the January 15, 2006 field trip will be to locate as many of the five surveyed points with latitude and longitude locations identified as possible, starting with Maple Creek, ■ JA-14 and South Rat Creek, ■ JA-15. Maple Creek appears to be just east of the White property, probably in the Oregon Department of Transportation's right-of-way for Interstate-5. The 1856 GLO field survey notes identified that it was 238 feet south of Maple Creek. South Rat Creek is located in the I-5 right-of-way just north of the summit.

As many members as possible of the *Hugo Emigrant Trails 1856 Field Survey Sub-Committee* (i.e., Mike Walker, Malcolm Drake, Kelly Rarey, and Glen Campbell), including Wayne McKy, Norm Tieman, and Karen Rose will meet Wyman White on the west side of the Hugo I-5 interchange at 1:00 p.m. Wyman will be providing a tour of the White Property and the old roads he remembers.

Three participants will use their skills as a geographic positioning system (GPS) operators: Wyman White, Malcolm Drake, and Kelly Rarey. Walker will record the information.

The field survey will be conducted by inserting the latitude and longitude coordinates into a GPS device and then traveling to that point. The survey will include taking notes and pictures of what is observed. Ultimately, with the land owner's permission, it might mean placing a marker on the Applegate Trail.
