Dear Mark, Jessica, and Sam:

The Hugo Emigrant Trails Committee (HETC) thanks ODOT for Sam Dunnavant's February 27, 2012 email response web published at HETC's *I-5: Glendale to Hugo Paving & Sexton Climbing Lane Project* web site (Appendices A & B).

We are pleased with the continued dialogue between ODOT and the HETC. Especially exciting for us is the idea that ODOT has been working with its project designers to alter the design plans of the *Sexton Mountain Climbing Lane Project* to pull the cut slope away from the Applegate Trail (*Trail*) segment that the HETC feels is a significant historical resource (i.e., 1,060' *Applegate Trail I North Sexton Pass I-5 East*; Appendix A). We are looking forward to our joint field trip to review ODOT's revised cut slope staked in the field.

By omission in Sam's February 27, 2012 email, we assume the ODOT does not plan to review and analyze our web published *Trail* inventories for Sexton Mountain as they pertain to *1,060' Applegate Trail I North Sexton Pass I-5 East* (Appendix A). If true, this position is disappointing as it is not what we were led to believe from our joint February 1, 2012 meeting.

We continue to be concerned when ODOT identifies pertinent cultural resource reports relating to *Trail* enquiries from the <u>original</u> *Sexton Mountain Climbing Lane Project* footprint as confidential when they relate to our National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) issues. The idea that ODOT identified zero cultural resources within the original project footprint is bewildering to us, and we feel necessitates an ODOT review of our *1,060' Applegate Trail I North Sexton Pass I-5 East* inventories per its NEPA policies.

The confidentially of ODOT's referenced confidential cultural resource reports is especially troublesome when ODOT's position is that the original project footprint will not be impacted. Why is a report, or parts of a report, confidential to a particular piece of geography when ODOT's position is that there are zero cultural resources there and zero impacts. We believe ODOT is in charge and responsible for the NEPA disclosure requirements of the categorical exclusion (CE) process for the *Sexton Mountain Climbing Lane Project*, not the Oregon State Historic Preservation Office.

We are also waiting patiently for responses to most of our issues and requests as identified in our February 1, 2012 Meeting Minutes For "I-5: Glendale to Hugo Paving & Sexton Climbing Lane Project" (Appendix A).

We request that this communication be made a formal part of testimony from the public on ODOT's NEPA CE process for ODOT's I-5 Glendale to Hugo Paving & Sexton Climbing Lane Project.
